#### **Guidelines for tops**

- One piece
- Minimum 1.75" (45 mm) diameter
- No sharp points or edges
- Sand to 400 grit
- Colour with water-based markers only
- No finish except for carnauba wax
- No wood from nut producing trees

If you are interested in having experimental or custom work done in these areas please contact me.


