February meeting featured Eric Deckert on making a Cryptex as featured in a recent Dan Brown novel "The Da Vinci Code". I took all the necessary photos to make the puzzle box BUT not so good, all my photos were out of focus.

Eric's presentation and techniques were great but no photographic record. While the end product looks as complicated as a watch to make, it wasn't, it was a number of turned parts where <u>accuracy</u> is the watchword for making the puzzle. No one part is beyond the skill set of most members.



- One piece
- Minimum size. At least 1.75" (45 mm) diameter (smaller tops are a choke hazard)
- No sharp points or edges
- Sand to 400 grit
- If you are colouring them use water-based markers only
- No finish except for carnauba wax
- No wood from nut producing trees
