

August Meeting: Casting and Stabilizing



Dave Bell demonstrated and informed of the process of casting and stabilizing wood for turning projects. The demonstration covered chambers, pumps, and an overview of the stabilizing process information. The Casting process covered the basics to begin with equipment, tools, and molds. The next step was how to cast a project which included resin calculations and determining which resin is best for you.

Please find a full and complete guide for casting that Dave has provided as a pdf posted on our website under the Techniques tab.

During the zoom demonstration, Dave talked to us about Alumalite, epoxy, Cactus juice (available from one of our Guild advertisers William Wood-Write at penlanks.ca), just to name a few. We also watched the awesome power of the vacuum chamber and what it can do to both rubber gloves and marshmallows!

September Meeting: Turning a Melting Box

Eric Deckert demonstrated the process of creating a Melting box. He shared with us that his inspiration came from a book in which he saw one of Terry Evan's melting pots. This type of pot or box is essentially created by having an inside turned cylinder, and then stacking the outer layer with 'donuts' or 'stones'. Building this beautiful structure starts with lamination and involves a lot of cutting on the bandsaw. Eric shared tips throughout his demo on gluing, clamping, using forstener bits efficiently, sanding, and overall design of making this unique piece.

- No sharp points or edges
- Sand to 400 grit
- If you are colouring them, use water-based markers only
- No finish except for carnauba wax
- No wood from nut producing trees
