# April Meeting: Return to In-Person Meetings at the Hall Demo: Mark Lush – Chainsaw: Bowl Blanks

Building on the chainsaw demonstration we saw last month, our demonstrator and guest, Mark Lush presented a previously recorded video of how he approaches cutting logs to get the best blanks for use in woodturning. Mark talked about chopping the tree or log into manageable sizes keeping in mind the type of project you want the wood for (whether you want bowl blanks, spindle blanks, etc.) and where there may be the most figure found in a log. He also covered in his presentation the best practices in cutting the log safely and provided tips when cutting out the pith. There was discussion about the types of chainsaws to use as well as the use of a ripping chain that may help when harvesting your wood. Mark mentioned the work of Phil Anderson (that can be looked up on YouTube) as a turner that turns a lot of imperfect or natural pieces, as well as AAW videos by Dale Larson as ones that members may want to check out.

The "Tops for Tots" initiative is an on-going challenge, initially started as a President's Challenge in June 2018, for all Guild members to generously give their time and share their talent for a great cause!

We have a collection box at the Hall so please continue to bring in your tops to donate to the Children's Health Foundation!

Please remember the guidelines for tops:

- One piece
- Minimum size. At least 1.75" (45 mm) diameter (smaller tops are a choke hazard)
- No sharp points or edges
- Sand to 400 grit
- If you are colouring them, use water-based markers only
- No finish except for carnauba wax
- No wood from nut producing trees
